FORWARD VIRGINIA BLUEPRINT

Phase I looks like this:

- Safer at home—especially if you are vulnerable
- No social gatherings of more than 10 individuals
- Continued social distancing
- Continued teleworking
- Face coverings recommended in public
- Easing limits on business and faith communities

Phase I: Guidelines for All Businesses

1. Physical distancing
2. Enhanced cleaning and disinfection
3. Enhanced workplace safety

Phase I could last 2-4 weeks or longer.

Phase II looks like this:

- Stay-at-home for vulnerable populations
 - No social gatherings of more than **50** individuals
 - Continued social distancing
 - Continued teleworking
 - Face coverings recommended in public
 - Further easing business limitations
- Phase 2 could last 2-4 weeks or longer

Phase III: Longer-term

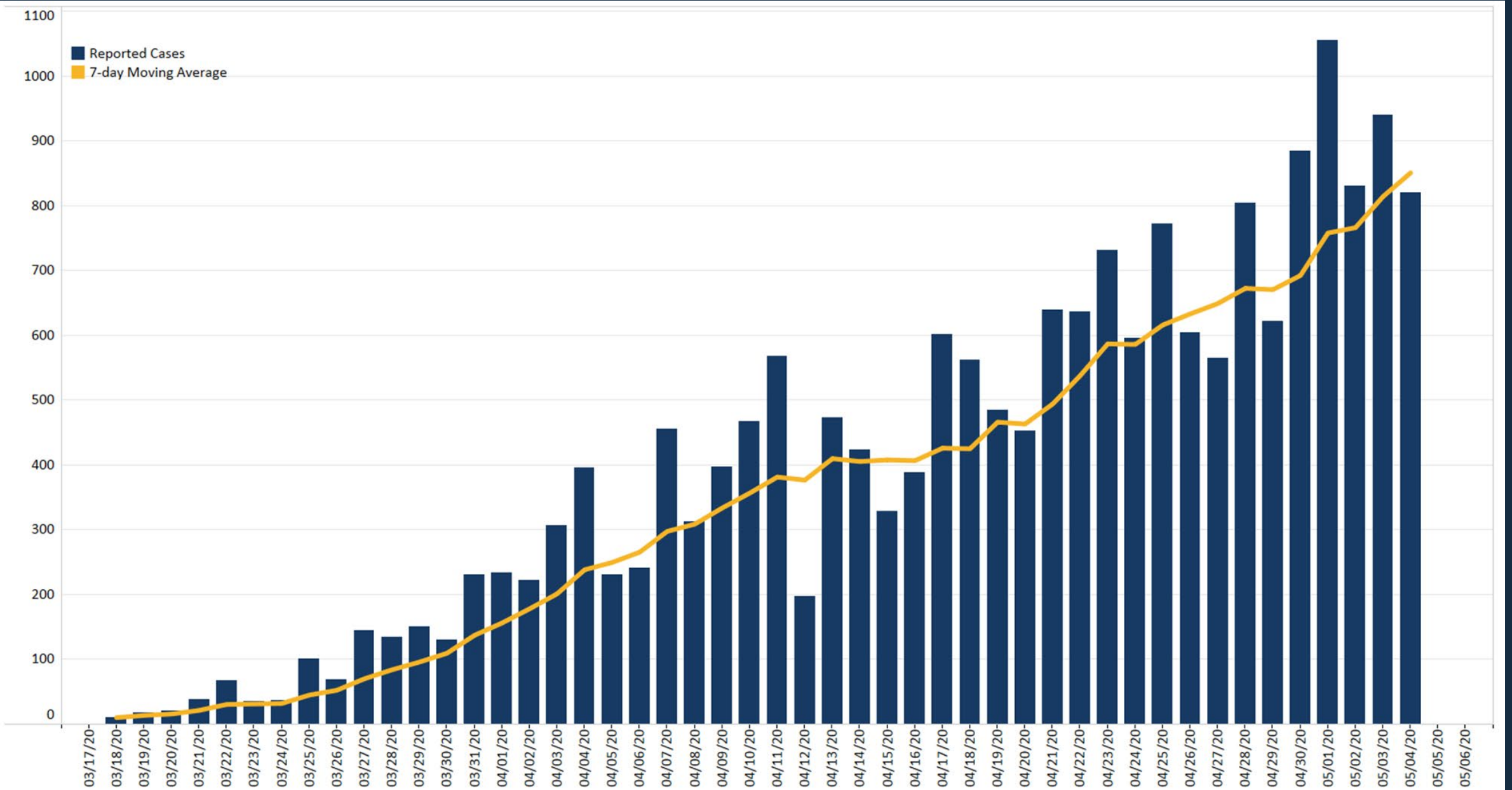
- To move to Phase III, we're looking for no evidence of rebound for a sustained period of time.
- Phase III looks like this:
 - Safer at home for vulnerable populations
 - Remove ban on social gatherings
 - Remove capacity limits in establishments
 - Continue heightened cleaning and disinfection
 - Possible other measures

Phase III could be 10-12 weeks away, or more.

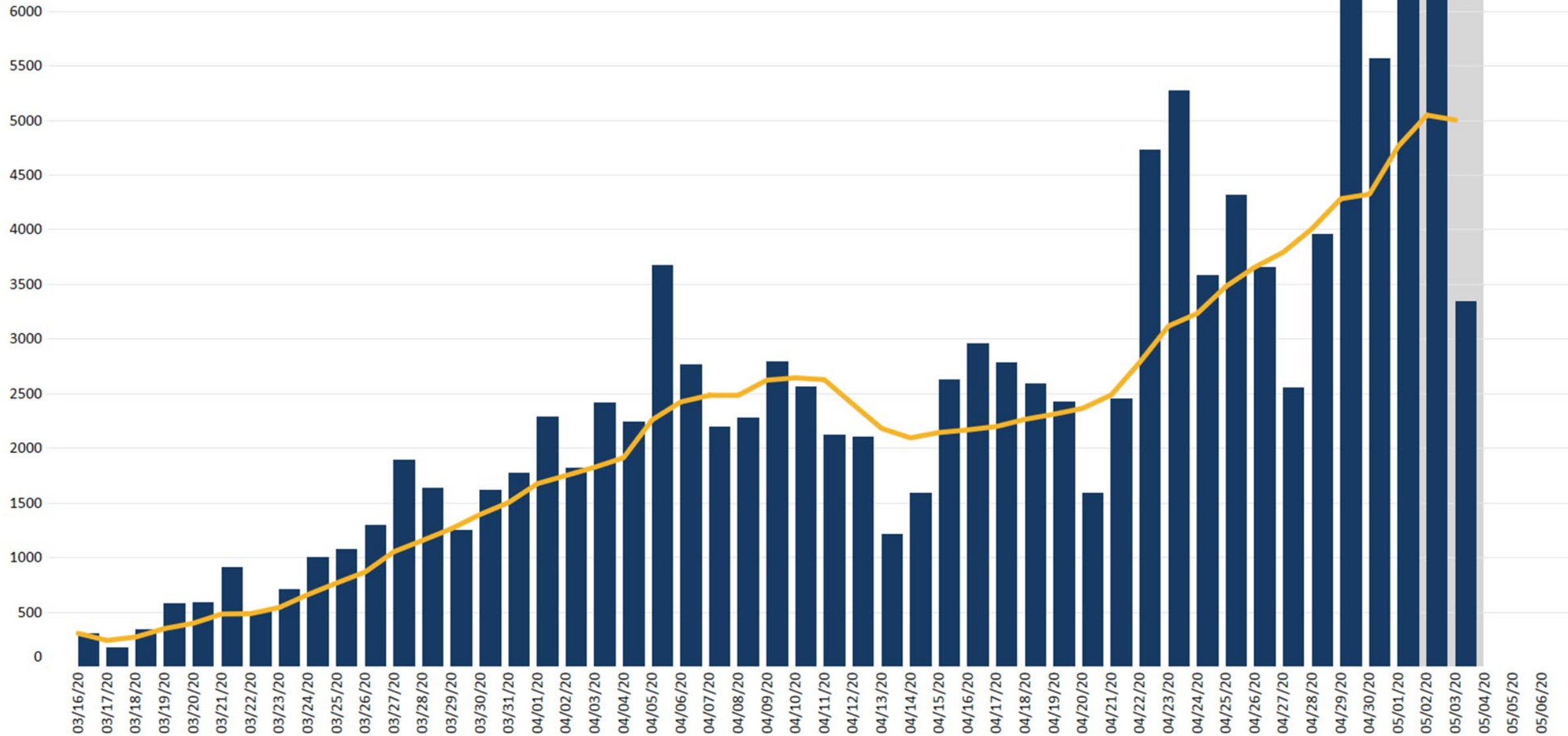


Cases by Date Reported

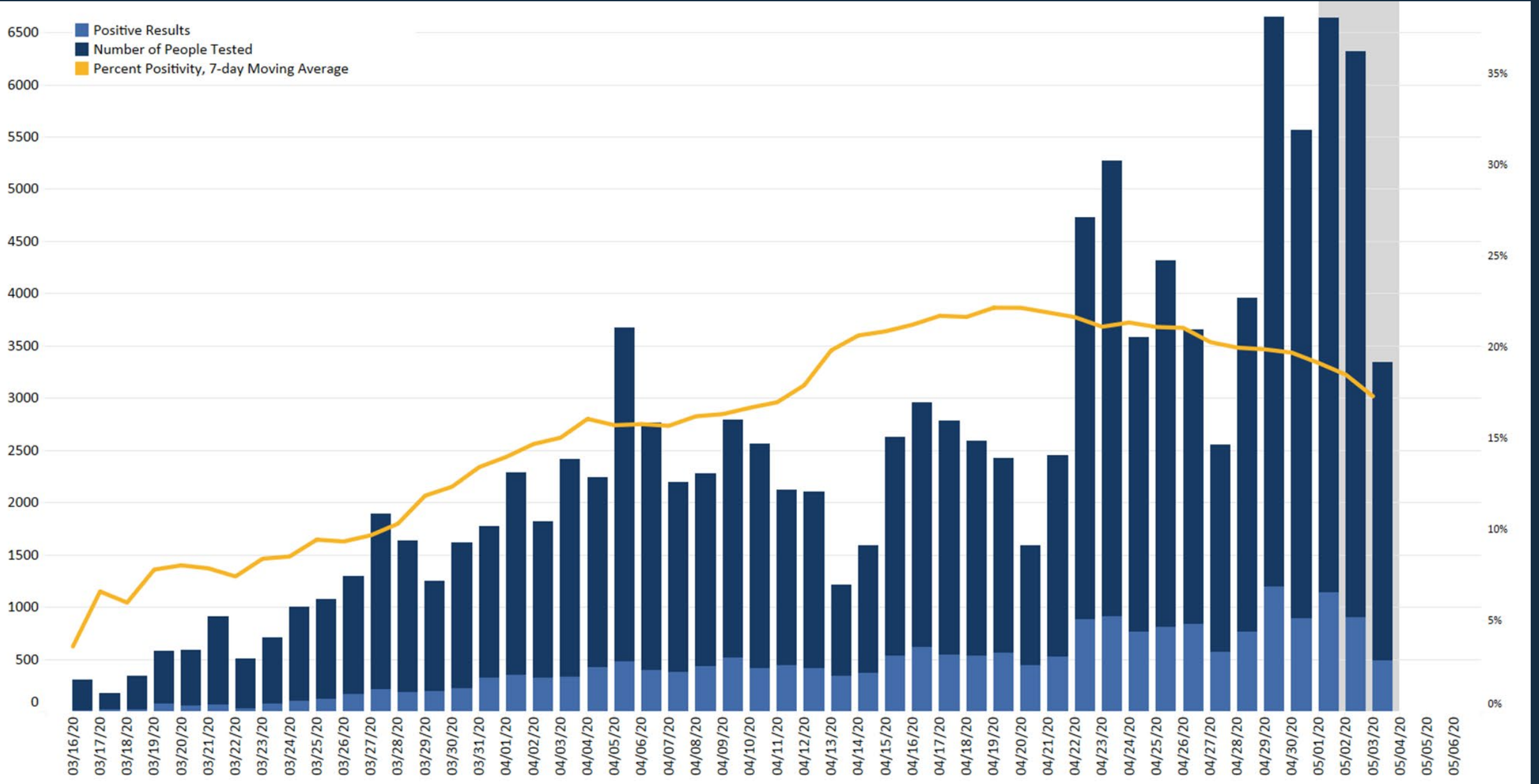


Number of People Tested Per Day, by lab report

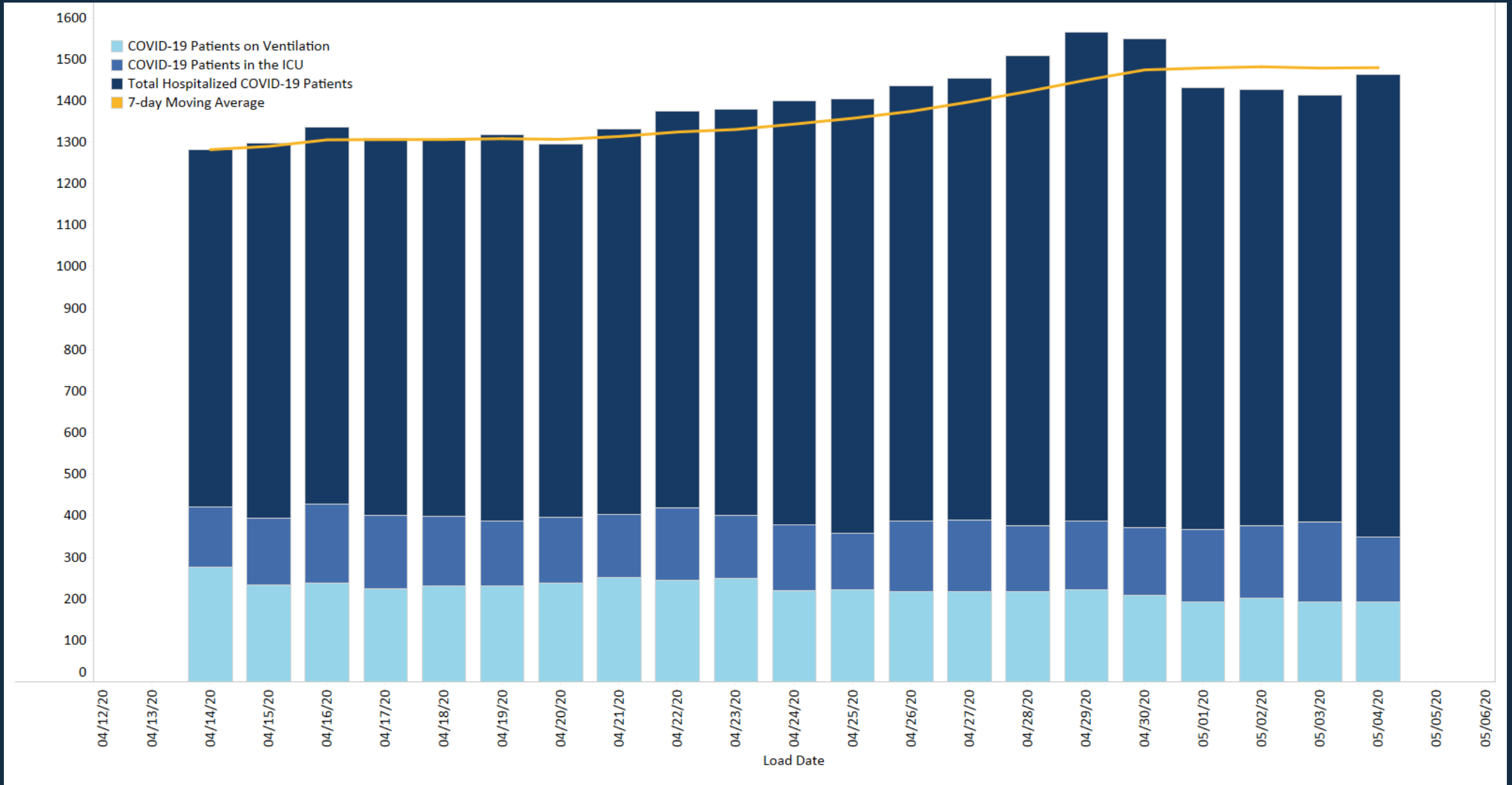
■ Number of People Tested
■ 7-Day Moving Average of Number of People Tested



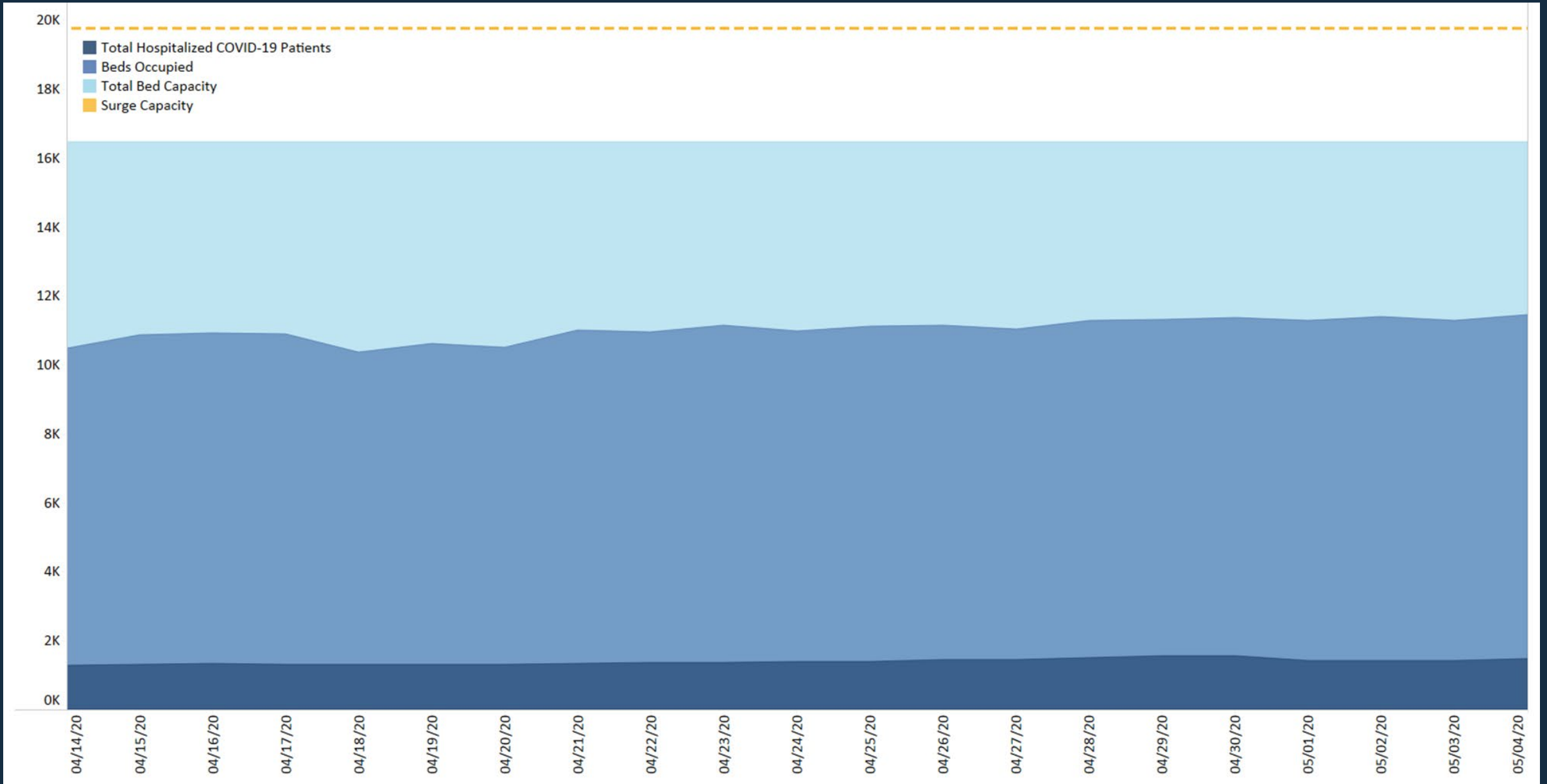
Positive Tests



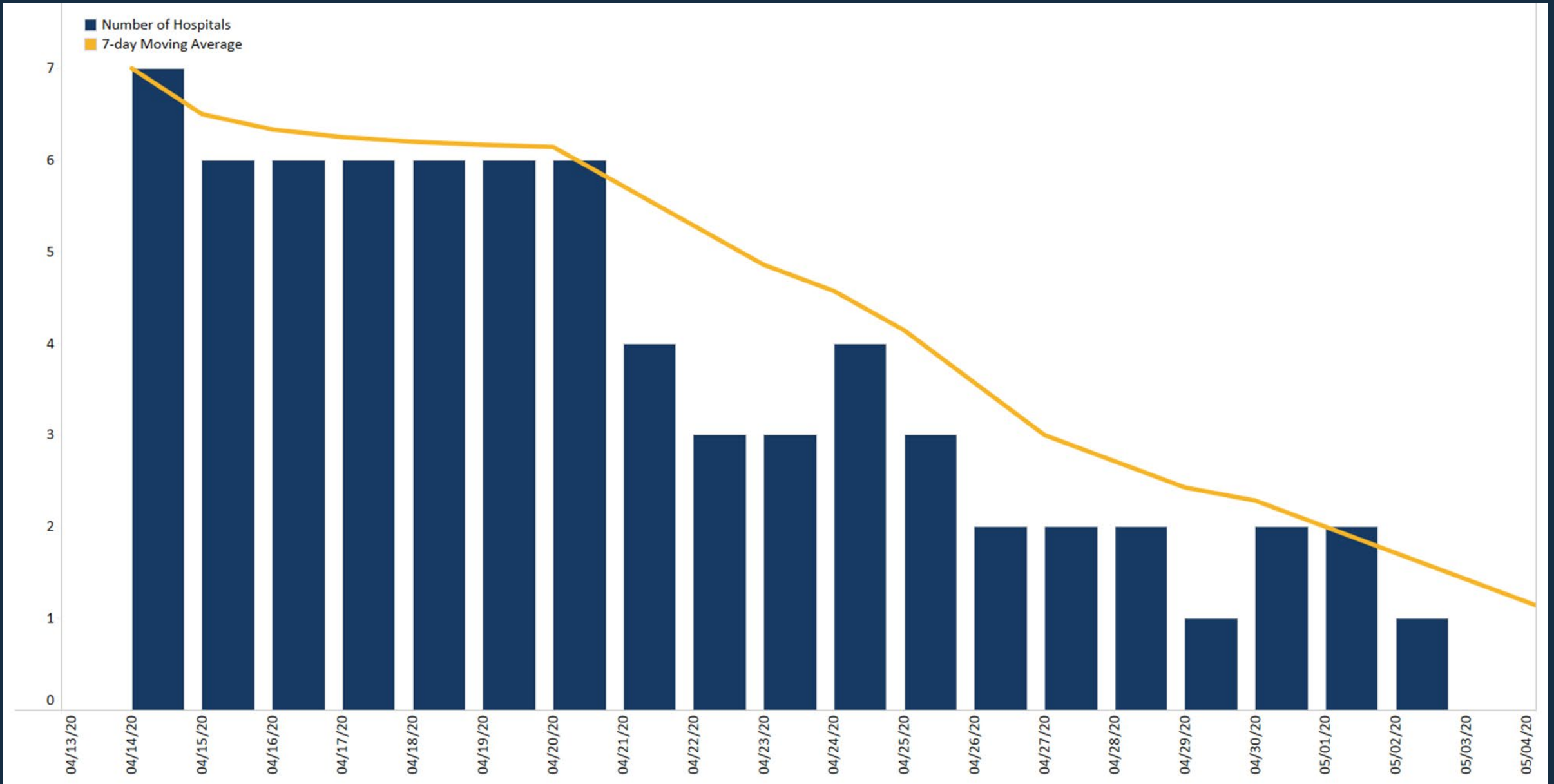
Hospital Patients Treated for COVID-19
